

From the desk of Fr. Baier...

Pentecost is the end of the Easter Season and the coming of the Holy Spirit upon God's people. Come Holy Spirit, Come! Descend on the people of St. Paul and give us the guidance and the inspiration we need to win souls for Christ. The first fruit of the Holy Spirit is love. In order to share love with others we first need to receive the love of Christ in our own lives.

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love! Amen.

I will be away again at another conference this week. Mike Coleman is coming with me for the Amazing Parish conference. I've asked Mike to join me and together we'll hear about ways and strategies for building an amazing parish. Mike joins me on the parish leadership team together with Amanda Davidson and Abby Pohlschneider. The three of them and myself make up the parish leadership team that meets weekly to pray with one another and to discuss ways to make St. Paul Parish more amazing. We'll return home on Thursday morning. Deacon Anthony Hoangpham will arrive at the parish that day and I'll have him introduce himself after the Masses of the weekend.

One of the fruits of Amazing Parish is creating a parish that prays for one another. We all have said before, I'll pray for you about this or that. What I will be modeling for you to do with each other, and what we'll be doing with the parish leadership team, is getting us to instead say, 'can we stop and pray now about this?' Perhaps this is a tremendous culture shift for us as a parish and it will take time to achieve, but I think it is a worthwhile step.

Lastly, I am looking at the possibility of beginning a Spanish Mass on Sundays either at 11am or 12pm. I've started talking with both the Archbishop and with the vicariate priests and they were very much in favor of the idea if there seems to be a proven need. I would like to hear your thoughts also. If we do start a Spanish Mass how do we keep it from being a separate St. Paul community, but rather connected and unifying our community? Sometime this summer, I'll have some listening sessions to hear thoughts on adding a Spanish Mass. We also need to discuss this as a pastoral council. However, for those of you who are very busy, I'd still love to hear your thoughts via phone or email. I want to hear what the community thinks. If this seems like a good idea, I would envision beginning the Spanish Mass in September. There are many Spanish speaking St. Paul residents who currently go to Mass at St. Peter, St. Luke, and Sacred Heart because they do not understand the Mass here in English.
